Flights

The main airport in Maui is the Kahului Airport (also known as the Maui International Airport), code OGG. This airport is 28 miles from the Hyatt Regency Maui Resort in Ka'anapali, about 45 minutes by car.

The much smaller Kapalua Airport in west Maui, code JHM, is served by commuter flights to and from Honolulu (code HNL). This airport is 5 miles from the Hyatt Regency Maui Resort, about 10 minutes by car.
